

SPML bags Maharashtra sewerage deal

SUBHASH Projects & Marketing (SPML) has bagged the Rs 525.79-crore underground sewerage scheme from Mira Bhayandar Municipal Corporation, Maharashtra. SPML will also be responsible for operation and maintenance of the newly-developed system for five years after commissioning.



The scope of work includes underground sewerage facilities in the 24 sq km area of Maharashtra within the next 30 months.

The project entails providing, laying and commissioning 107 kilometres of sewer lines; design, construction and commissioning

of 10 pumping stations and 10 sewage treatment plants with capacities ranging from 7 million litres per day (mld) to 17 mld.

In a media statement issued on Monday, the company said the scope of work will also include providing the necessary pressurised ring mains for distribution and disposal of recycled water.

Designed on a completely decentralised system having 10 zones across Mira Bhayandar, the project is expected to be completed by August 2011.

“The project will complement the growing urban needs of Mira Bhayandar — one of Maharashtra’s fastest developing zones,” said SPML vice chairman Subhash Sethi.

Incidentally, this order is SPML’s third in the last four weeks, with a cumulative value Rs 1191.79 crore, the company release stated.
