### Report on the audit of the Standalone Ind AS Standalone Ind As financial statements

### **Opinion**

We have audited the accompanying standalone INDAS financial statements of BHAGALPUR ELECTRICITY DISTRIBUTION COMPANY PRIVATE LIMITED ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2023, the Statement of Profit and Loss for the year ended, the statement of cash flow and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information which we have signed under reference to this report.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act,2013 ('the Act') in the manner so required and give a true and Fair view in conformity with the Indian Accounting Standards prescribed under section 133 of the Act read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended, ("Ind As") and other accounting Principles generally accepted in India, of the state of the affairs of the Company as at 31stMarch 2023.

### **Emphasis of Matter**

We draw attention to Note no. 22 of the standalone Ind As financial statements which states that the distribution services of the Company have been terminated by SBPDCL w.e.f. 25<sup>th</sup> November, 2017. In accordance with the Power Distribution Agreement with SBPDCL, the Company has referred the above matters for Arbitration. These standalone Ind As financial statements have been prepared on a Going concern basis on the assumption that the Company will succeed in recovering its claim upon completion of the Arbitration. In view of the above, Property Plant and Equipment and Inventory of Rs. 1,474.93/- Lacs and Rs. 840.7 Lacs has been reclassified to Claims Receivable in accordance with the Termination clause of the Distribution Franchisee Agreement into SBPDCL. Our opinion is not qualified in this matter.

### **Basis for Opinion**

We have conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Ind As financial statements section of report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the Independent requirements that are relevant to our audit of the standalone Ind As financial statements under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules thereunder, and We have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence, we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.



### Information Other than the Standalone Ind As financial statements and Auditor's Report Thereon

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Annexure to Board's report but does not include the standalone Ind As financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the standalone Ind As financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance or conclusion thereon.

In connection with our Audit of the standalone Ind As financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the standalone Ind As financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work, we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.







### Notes on Financial Statements for the year ended 31st March, 2023

### 1 Significant Accounting Policies

### 1.1 Basis of preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared and presented under the historical cost convention, on the accrual basis of accounting except as otherwise stated elsewhere and comply with the notified Accounting Standards as prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act') read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and the provisions of the Act (to the extent notified). The accounting policies applied by the Company are consistent with those applied in the previous year except where adoption of a different accounting policy is required by statute or for compliance with an accounting standard or if it is considered that the change would result in a more appropriate presentation of the financial statements of the Company.

The financial statements are presented in Indian Rupees (₹ Lacs).

### 1.2 Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) requires the management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures relating to contingent liabilities as at the date of the financial statements and the reported income and expenses during the reporting year. Although these estimates are based upon the management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates. Any revision to the accounting estimates are recognised prospectively in the current and future years.

### 1.3 Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and Cash Equivalents in the Cash Flow Statement comprise of cash on hand at bank, demand deposits with banks, cheques on hand, remittances in transit and short-term highly liquid investments with an original maturity of three months or less.

### 1.4 Property, Plant & Equipment, Depreciation and Impairment

### a) Property, Plant & Equipment

Property, Plant & Equipment is carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. Cost comprises of the purchase price and any directly attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use.

### b) Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on the Written down Value ('WDV') method as per the rates and in the manner prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013. Management estimates the useful lives of Property, Plant & Equipment to be in accordance with the useful lives prescribed in the aforementioned Schedule.

Depreciation on assets acquired/ disposed off during the year is provided for from/upto the date of such addition/deletion.

### c) Impairment

Chartered

The Company periodically assesses whether there is any indication that an asset or a group of assets, comprising a cash generating unit, may be impaired. If any such indication exists, the Company estimates the recoverable amount of the asset. For an asset or group of assets that does not generate largely independent cash inflows, the recoverable amount is determined for the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. If such recoverable amount of the asset or the recoverable amount of the cash generating unit to which the asset belongs is less than its carrying

amount, the carrying amount is reduced to its recoverable amount. The reduction is treated as an impairment loss and is recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss. If at the balance sheet date there is an indication that a previously assessed impairment loss no longer exists, the recoverable amount is reassessed and the asset is reflected at the recoverable amount subject to a maximum of depreciable historical cost. An impairment loss is reversed only to the extent that the carrying amount of asset does not exceed the net book value that would have been determined; if no impairment loss had been recognised.

### 1.5 Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured:

- a) Incomes from Job work are recognized pro-rata over the period of the contract as and when services are rendered. The Company collects service tax on behalf of the government and, therefore, it is not an economic benefit flowing to the Company. Hence, it is excluded from revenue. Other fee based income is accounted for on accrual basis.
- b) Interest is recognized using the time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the interest rate applicable.
- c) Dividend income is recognized when the right to receive the dividend is established.
- d) All other income is accounted for on accrual basis.

### 1.6 Investments

Investments are classified as either current or non-current based on Management's intention at the time of purchase. Non-current investments are carried at cost. However, provision for diminution in value other than temporary in nature, is made to recognise a decline on an individual basis.

Current investments are carried at lower of cost and fair value. The comparison of cost and fair value is done separately in respect of each category of investments.

### 1.7 Retirement benefits

### (a) Provident Fund

The Company does not have minimum number of employees to qualify for contribution of Provident fund, hence provision in respect of Provident Fund is not considered necessary.

### (b) Gratuity

The Company does not have minimum number of employees to qualify for Provision of Gratuity Act, hence provision in respect of the same has not been considered necessary.

### 1.7 Earnings per share (EPS)

Basic EPS is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year, attributable to equity shareholders, by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period. For the purpose of calculating diluted EPS, the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

### 1.8 Taxes on Income

Income tax expense comprises current tax (i.e. amount of tax for the year determined in accordance with the income tax law) and deferred tax charge or credit (reflecting the tax effects of timing differences between accounting income and taxable income for the year). The deferred tax charge or credit and the corresponding deferred tax liabilities or assets are recognised using the tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent there is reasonable certainty that the assets can be realised in future; however, where there is unabsorbed depreciation or carried forward business loss under taxation laws, deferred tax assets are recognised only if there is a virtual certainty of realisation of such assets. Deferred tax assets/liabilities are reviewed as at each balance sheet date and written down or

written-up to reflect the amount that is reasonably/virtually certain (as the case may be) to be realised.

The Company offsets the current (on a year on year basis) and deferred tax assets and liabilities, where it has a legally enforceable right and where it intends to settle such assets and liabilities on a net basis.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 115JAA of the Income-tax Act, 1961, the Company is allowed to avail credit equal to the excess of Minimum Alternate Tax (MAT) over normal income tax for the assessment year for which MAT is paid. MAT credit so determined can be carried forward for set-off for ten succeeding assessment years from the year in which such credit becomes allowable. MAT credit can be set-off only in the year in which the Company is liable to pay tax as per the normal provisions of the Income-tax Act, 1961 and such tax is in excess of MAT for that year. Accordingly, MAT credit entitlement is recognised only to the extent there is convincing evidence that the Company will pay normal tax during the specified period.

### 1.10 Provisions and Contingencies

A provision is recognised when the company has a present obligation as a result of past event and it is probable that outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to their present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

Contingent Liabilities are not recognized but are disclosed in the notes to financial statements. Contingent Assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the notes to financial statements.

### Note 21. Capital management

For the purpose of the Company's capital management, capital includes issued equity capital, share premium and all other equity reserves attributable to the equity holders of the parent. The primary objective of the Company's capital management is to maximise the shareholder value.

The Company's objectives when managing capital is to safeguard continuity, maintain a strong credit rating and healthy capital ratios in order to support its business and provide adequate return to shareholders through continuing growth and maximise the shareholders value. The Company's overall strategy remains unchanged from previous year. The Company sets the amount of capital required on the basis of annual business and long-term operating plans which include capital and other strategic investments. The funding requirements are met through a mixture of equity ,internal fund generation and borrowed funds. The Company's policy is to use short term and longterm borrowings to meet anticipated funding requirements. The Company monitors capital on the basis of the net debt to equity ratio. The Company is not subject to any externally imposed capital requirements. Net debt are long term and short term debts as reduced by cash and cash equivalents (including restricted cash and cash equivalents). Equity comprises share capital and free reserves (total reserves excluding OCI). The following table summarizes the capital of the Company:

Note 22: Consequent to the ongoing disputes, in relation with Billing rate, dues of Municipal Corporation, interest rate etc. with South Bihar Power Distribution Company Limited (SBPDCL), the company has discontinued the service of Electricty distribution with effect from 25th November, 2017 in the assigned area and SBPDCL has taken physical control of the Property, Plant and Equipments (PPE) and Inventory. In accordance with the Power Distribution Agreement with SBPDCL, the Company has referred the above matters for Arbitration. These financial statements have been prepared on a Going concern basis on the assumption that the Company will suceed in recovering its claims upon completion of the Arbitration. In view of the above, PPE and Inventory of Rs.1474.93/- lacs and Rs.840.7/- lacs has been reclassified to Claims Receivable in accordance with the Termination clause of the Distribution Franchisee Agreement entered into with SBPDCL.

Pursuant to the above arbitration, the Company has reduced Purchase cost of Energy by an amount of Rs. 11,194.56/- Lacs, being the Average Billing Rate recoverable from SBPDCL for the period from January, 2014



Note 23: Income Tax Department had issued a Demand Notice for Rs. 1,45,85,280/— vide order dated 29.12.2016 which was passed by the Jurisdictional Assessing Officer. Further appeal has been made to the Commissioner of the income Tax (Appealsi-CIT (A)-Kolkata. Further appeal has been made to the commissioner of the income Tax (Appealsi-CIT (A)-Kolkata and the company has paid Rs. 21,91,000/— against the said demand as deposit. The Company expects to get full relief against the said demand from the Appellate Authorities.
